Who Benefits from GSP? Everyone! *The tariff savings from GSP are spread throughout the economy, to the tune of approximately \$850 million in 2008. While many people think that imports just help lower prices for consumers, consumer goods (excluding food and automobiles) accounted for only 13.5 percent of imports under GSP in 2008.*

The biggest users of the GSP program are actually U.S. manufacturers, who benefited from duty-free treatment for industrial supplies, raw materials, and capital goods worth more than \$23 billion in 2008, or 72.5 percent of total imports under the GSP program.
