What Does It Mean? *The top 10 GSP beneficiaries are a regionally mixed group spanning Asia, Africa, Latin America, and Europe. Most of the leading GSP beneficiaries had a per capita income in 2007 that was less than half of the automatic country “graduation” income of approximately \$11,500.*

GSP is relatively limited in benefiting these countries’ exports to the United States. *Even though they are the major “users” of GSP, except for Angola and Equatorial Guinea, most of the products that the United States imports from these leading beneficiaries **do not receive GSP benefits.***
