

GSP MATTERS FOR NEW HAMPSHIRE

The Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) program allows U.S. companies to import certain products duty free from developing countries. In 2012, GSP **eliminated tariffs on nearly \$20 billion worth of imports** and **saved American companies \$750 million**, including those in New Hampshire.

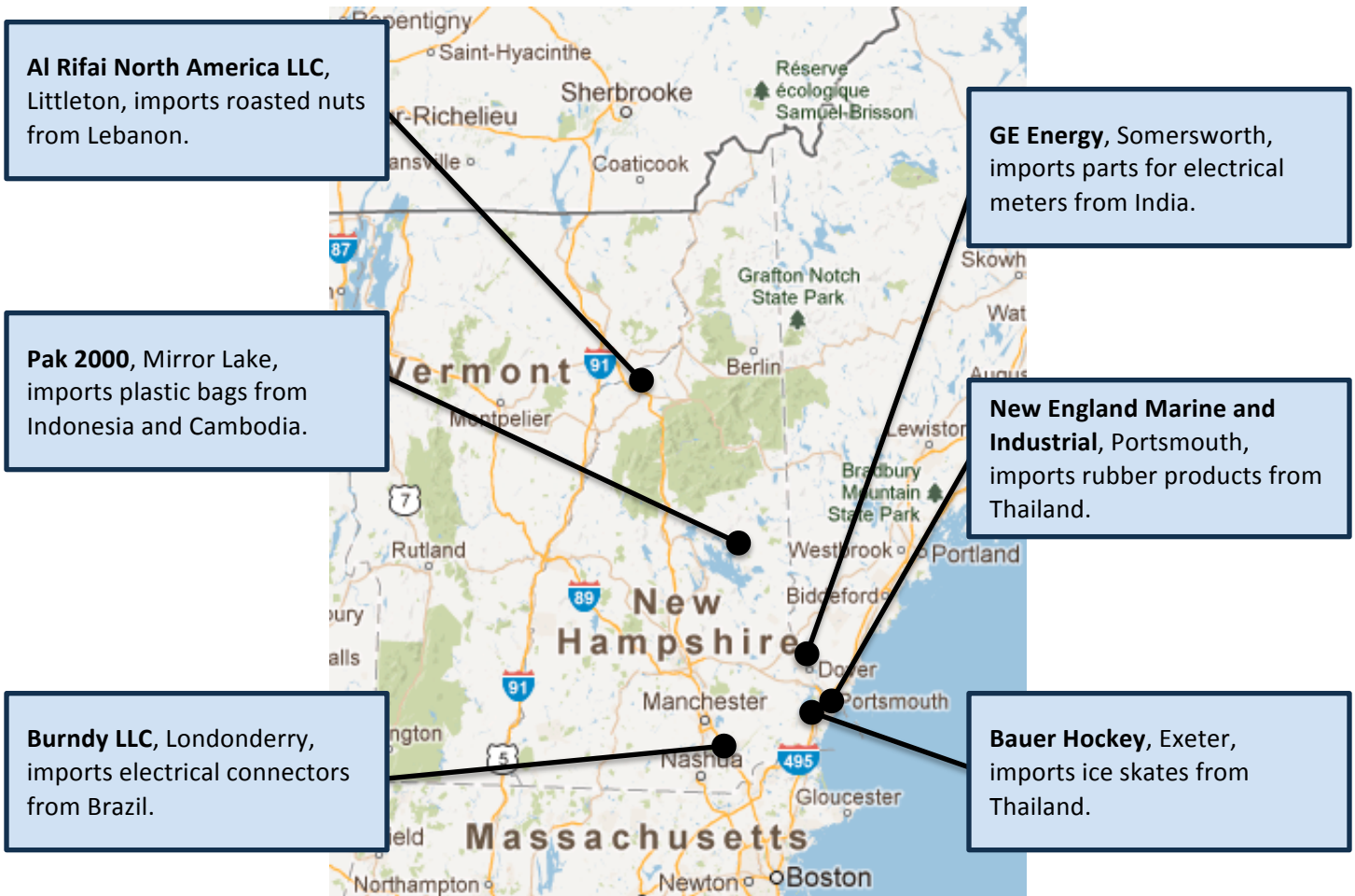
Yet GSP expires on July 31, 2013 and Congress must pass legislation to renew GSP for New Hampshire companies to continue receiving these benefits.

NEW HAMPSHIRE COMPANIES IMPORTING GSP-ELIGIBLE GOODS

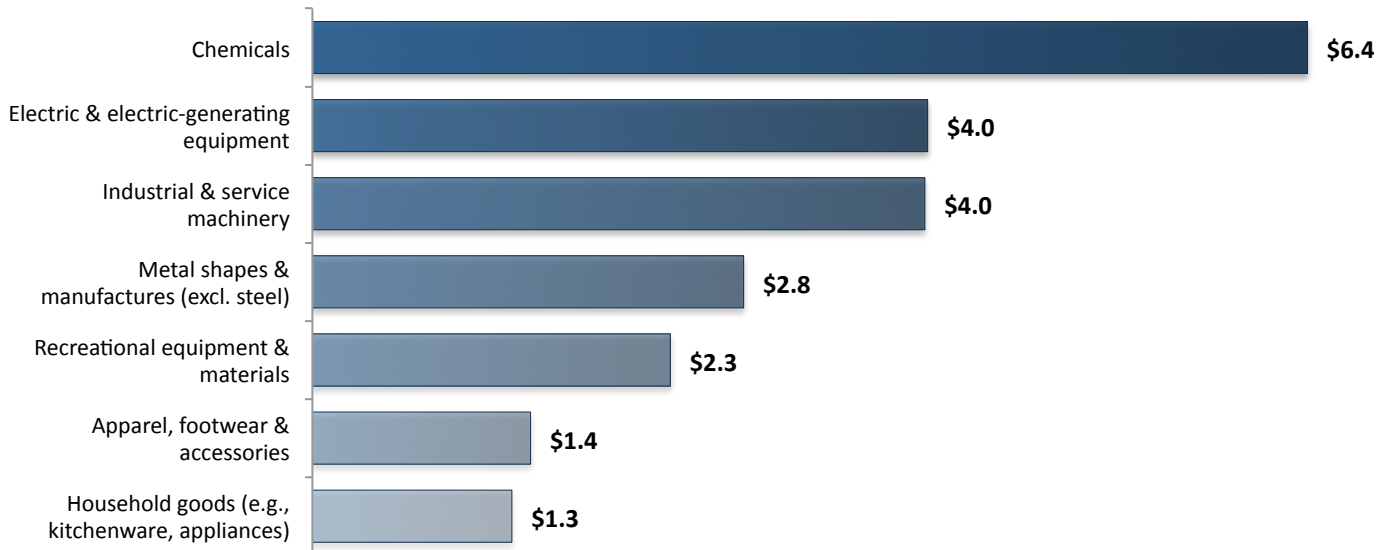

NEW HAMPSHIRE'S GSP IMPORTS BY PRODUCT TYPE

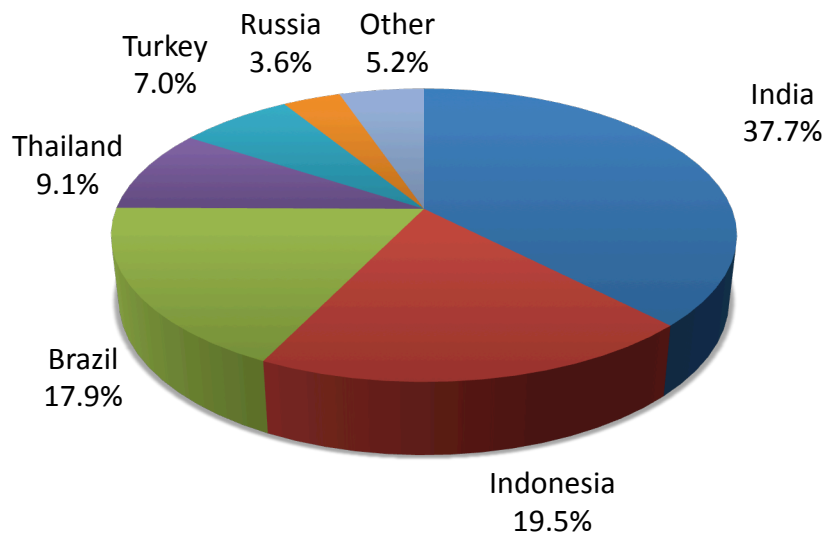
Most New Hampshire imports under GSP are raw materials and industrial goods whose duty-free treatment helps New Hampshire companies remain competitive.

NEW HAMPSHIRE'S GSP IMPORTS BY SOURCE COUNTRY

GSP eliminates tariffs on certain products from more than 130 countries, but the vast majority of New Hampshire imports under GSP come from a handful of countries, led by **India**, **Indonesia**, and **Brazil**.
